



Benjamins Mill Wind Project

Natural Forces is proposing to develop a wind energy project near Falls Lake, Nova Scotia. The Benjamins Mill Wind Project would consist of an estimated 10-24 turbines with the capacity to produce 50-100 MW of clean renewable energy. This proposed project would supply enough electricity to power up to an estimated 61,800 Nova Scotia homes.

The proposed Benjamins Mill Wind Project is located approximately 10 km southwest of Windsor on private and Crown Land.

This project is being proposed by the partnership between Natural Forces and Wskijnu'k Mtmo'taqnuow Agency Ltd (WMA), a corporate body wholly owned by the 13 Mi'kmaw bands in Nova Scotia.


